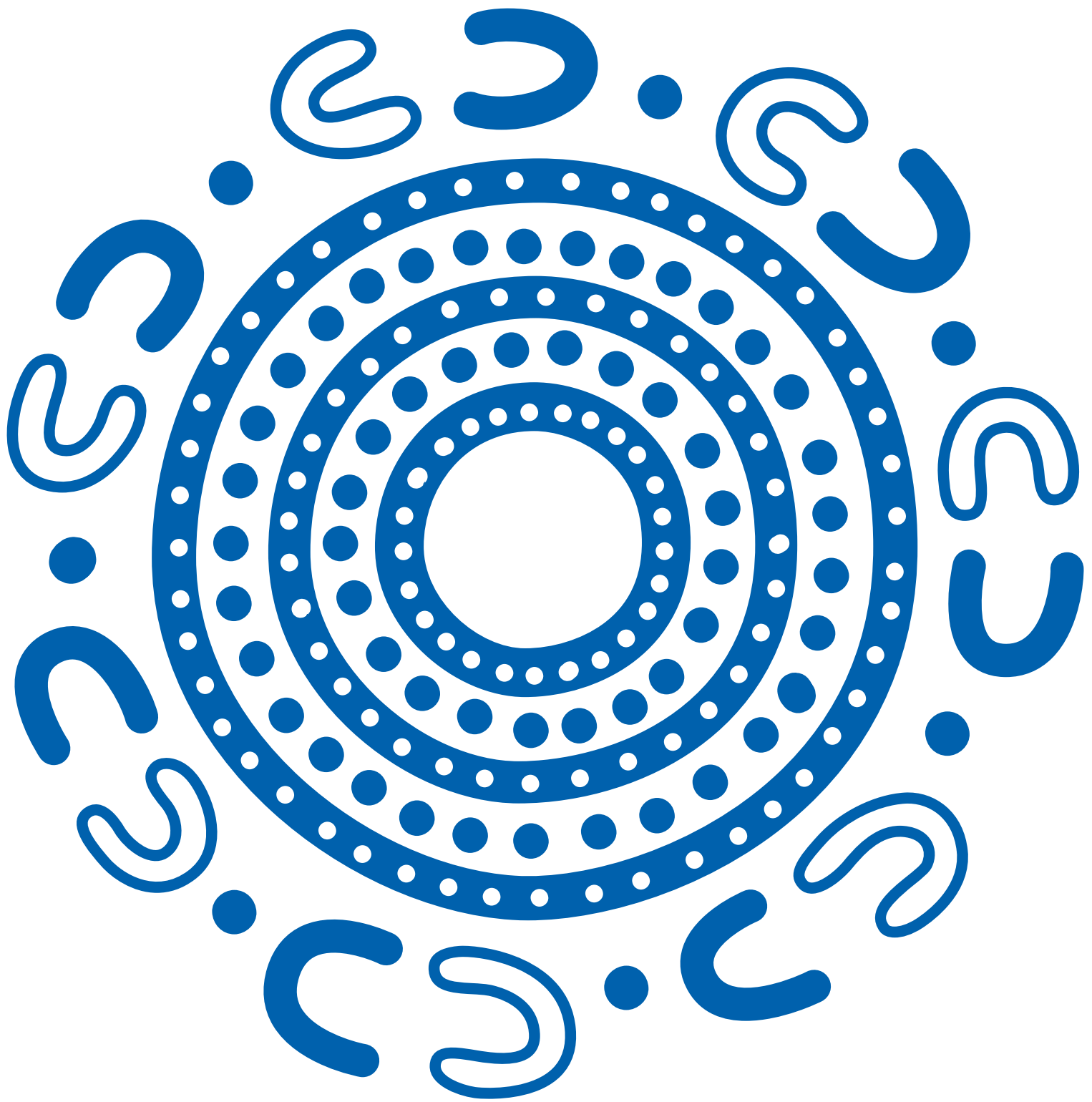

## Dandenong Wellbeing Centre, Vic

### CITY OF GREATER DANDENONG

The Dandenong Wellbeing Centre is an upcoming state-of-the-art facility designed to enhance community health and wellness in the City of Greater Dandenong.

This modern complex will feature indoor pools, a gymnasium, dry program rooms, and community health facilities, including two warm water program pools. These pools are intended to meet the community's demand for programmable warm water spaces, serving both structured programming and casual use.

The project features large-span engineered timber beams to the main pool hall, and foyer / entry areas. The centre will also offer over 200 square meters of allied health consulting suites, community rooms, a café, and an integrated sports pavilion for adjacent hockey fields. This holistic design aims to create a welcoming environment that encourages health, well-being, and social engagement among residents.

It will provide opportunities for people of all ages, cultures, and abilities to be active, social, and engaged in their health. The facility will offer swimming, general fitness, rehabilitation, social spaces, and culturally inclusive programs, playing a key role in supporting physical and mental wellbeing across the City of Greater Dandenong.

## Rouse Hill Town Centre, NSW

### GPT GROUP

ADCO has been selected as Builder of Choice for the design and construction of Stage 2 of the Rouse Hill Town Centre (RHTC) project.

RHTC is a vibrant mixed-use precinct in Sydney's northwest, renowned for its seamless integration of retail, commercial, civic, community, and residential spaces. The region is undergoing rapid growth, with the population expected to reach 500,000 within the next 25 years.

This exciting development includes approximately 40,000m<sup>2</sup> of site area with an additional 10,621m<sup>2</sup> with over 47 retail space, accommodating mini-major and specialty tenancies. It also sets the foundation for future growth, with plans to integrate multi-story apartment buildings. By replacing existing open-air parking and service areas, the project will support RHTC's continued

growth while meeting the increasing demands of retailers and the community.

As part of the project, ADCO will secure all necessary authority approvals and deliver a thoughtfully designed community space. The additional building structures and services will not only enhance the retail experience but also provide essential infrastructure for the future residential components of the development.

### KINGSTON CITY COUNCIL

We are excited to announce that ADCO has been appointed to construct the new Aquatic and Leisure Centre for the City of Kingston. Valued at \$87 million, this is the largest project ever undertaken by the City of Kingston and will be a great asset to the local community improving overall health and well-being.

Key features of the new centre include:

- 4 Pools: A 50m multi-purpose lap swimming pool, learn-to-swim pool, warm water exercise pool, and leisure pool
- Wellness Facilities: Spa, sauna, and steam room for relaxation and recovery
- Gym and Fitness Areas: State-of-the-art facilities to support an active lifestyle
- Café: A vibrant space for socializing and refreshments; and
- Ancillary Services: Modern foyer, change village, and ample car parking.

Located at the Governor Road site in Mordialloc, construction is set to commence towards the end of the year, with completion anticipated by mid 2026.

The Perth Concert Hall is preparing for a transformative redevelopment and ADCO is proud to play a key role in this significant project.

We were appointed to deliver the Early Contractor Involvement (ECI) and Enabling Works phases, which lay the foundation for the venue's next chapter while preserving its heritage and world-class acoustics.

The ECI phase provided detailed investigations, management plans, and reports to support the WA Government's design team for the Main Works. The enabling phase included the demolition of the southern forecourt and car park, as well as structural remediation in preparation for the Main Works starting early 2026.

This redevelopment will enhance the visitor experience for local, interstate, and international audiences while safeguarding the cultural and architectural integrity of this iconic venue.

ADCO is proud to contribute to a project that will support the arts community and ensure the Perth Concert Hall remains a leading cultural destination for years to come.

The Main Works will feature:

- Level 1 and Level 2 Redevelopment – including expanded spaces and auditorium reconfiguration.
- Building Repair and Service Upgrades – enhancing infrastructure while preserving the venue's heritage.
- Forecourt and Façade Upgrades – creating new landscaped spaces and improving public access.

## Kennedy Community Centre, Vic

### HAWTHORN FOOTBALL CLUB

ADCO has delivered the Hawthorn Football Club, Kennedy Community Centre; the club's new elite training and administration facility in Dingley.

Working with the consultant team to complete the ECI phase, ADCO completed the design and construction of the new headquarters and community facility, an impressive site spanning 28 hectares.

The Centre features a community pavilion and oval built to ensure gender-equal facilities and public amenities, specifically for community use and engagement.

The Centre includes the Harris Elite Performance and Administration facility, which caters for all Hawthorn teams equally and includes an elite gymnasium, full aquatic facilities, including a magnesium pool and dry sauna and equal amenities and locker rooms for both AFL and AFLW programs.

Alongside an MCG-sized training oval is the dedicated AFLW Oval and Community Pavilion, boasting full broadcast facilities, floodlights for night games and purpose-built spaces for future AFLW matches and community use.

Administrative spaces for community and not-for-profit organisations share the club's resources, creating a healthy, inclusive, and cohesive culture through participation.

## Common Ground, WA

### DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITIES

The WA Housing Authority, operating within the Department of Communities is progressing the delivery of the “Common Ground facility” in Perth as part of the “All Paths Lead to a Home”, Western Australia’s 10-Year Strategy on Homelessness 2020-2030.

Common Ground is an evidence-based model of permanent, supportive housing where people who have experienced chronic homelessness and/or rough sleeping are housed and supported, alongside low-income earners, in a purpose-built residence, and on-site, wrap-around services are provided to individuals who need them.

These services include case management support and may also include support for physical and mental illnesses, support for substance abuse, links to education, training and employment opportunities.

ADCO was selected as the Builder of Choice on the project which involved the construction of 29 studio and 83 one-bedroom apartments with self-contained kitchens and bathrooms.

Other features include secure landscaped podium with shared BBQ areas, shade structure and seating areas, communal dining, lounge and kitchen spaces, leasable commercial spaces for the provision of on-site medical services, café and community services. Office spaces and meeting rooms for Community Housing providers and operators and vehicle parking will also be provided.

## Nellie Hamilton Centre, NSW

ADCO has completed the design and construction of the Nellie Hamilton Centre for Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council (QPRC).

Consolidating Council staff spread across 11 buildings across the CBD, the development completes the Council's CBD Transformation Strategy. This also involved modernising the surrounding public and commercial space and improving connections to the existing Bicentennial Hall and Q Theatre.

The works involved constructing a contemporary flexible workspace for the Government across two integrated towers, dedicated council administration, including shopfront and public library space, meeting rooms and break-out spaces, community and commercial space, a gallery connecting the office building to Bicentennial Hall and Q Theatre, 100 basement car parking spaces for council offices and public and a rooftop garden.

## RUAH Centre, WA

### RUAH COMMUNITY SERVICES

ADCO is proud to have delivered a purpose built centre for women and children escaping family violence for RuaH Community Services in Northbridge Perth.

The first of its kind, the \$27 million RuaH Centre for Women and Children is a seven-storey development providing accommodation and support services for women and children as they recover from domestic violence, assisting them in building a new future for themselves.

The facility includes 3 floors dedicated to women's health and family empowerment services, 2 floors with support services and 2 floors of short-term accommodation.

Considered a centre of excellence the building will also facilitate research and collaboration to help end family violence.

## Oran Park Leisure Centre, NSW

### CAMDEN COUNCIL

The Oran Park Leisure Centre is a significant addition to the Oran Park precinct. This state-of-the-art facility is designed to support the growing needs of the Camden community, featuring a cutting-edge aquatic centre, gym, multiple indoor sports courts, and versatile community spaces. It provides a wide range of programs, including swimming lessons, fitness classes, and recreational activities for athletes and families alike.

A true anchor development for the area, it includes a 50-metre indoor Olympic swimming pool, learn to swim pool connected to a leisure pool, warm water pool, spa/sauna along with associated amenities, spectator seating and plant room spaces.

The facility provides the community with a sports pavilion with 4 basketball courts adaptable to multiple sports, a gymnasium with multipurpose rooms, appraisal rooms, office and storerooms as well as a reception area, retail space, café, kitchen and activity meeting rooms, with an underground basement car park and external on-grade parking.

As the Builder of Choice for this significant project, the largest ever delivered by Camden Council, we are incredibly proud of the impact this centre will have on the region. It is not just a place for physical activity, but a true hub for the community to come together, stay active, and connect.

## Kaggarabah, Qld

### QLD GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY & PUBLIC WORKS

ADCO is proud to have been the builder of choice for the revitalisation of Kaggarabah (formerly known as the Joyce Wilding Hostel); a centre that has provided refuge for vulnerable women and children in Queensland for over half a century.

The development adds seven two-storey blocks to the existing site, with four apartments in each, set in a shared, landscaped surrounding. An integrated communal hub provides space for essential support services and communal interactions, with another five apartments located above.

Sheltered BBQ facilities, a yarning circle, a kids' play area, a community garden and a parking area are also part of the facilities ADCO's team are completing. The centre is designed so visitors filter through the hub before they are officially granted access to the short-term accommodation area.

The facility benefits the local community significantly by continuing to aid vulnerable women and children as they seek assistance from domestic violence.

The facility includes four indoor sports courts for basketball and netball, new bowls green and seven tennis courts as well as the upgraded facilities for all Clubs associated with the Park and better facilities for casual users.

This facility provides accessible pedestrian access through and around the precinct creating a 'community feel' through a strong connection between the bowls and tennis clubs, social spaces and amenities.

The centre focuses on local community sport and recreation use and aims to increase and enhance female participation.

ADCO is thrilled to have completed the \$62 million Western Bulldogs' Stage 2 Redevelopment of the Whitten Oval.

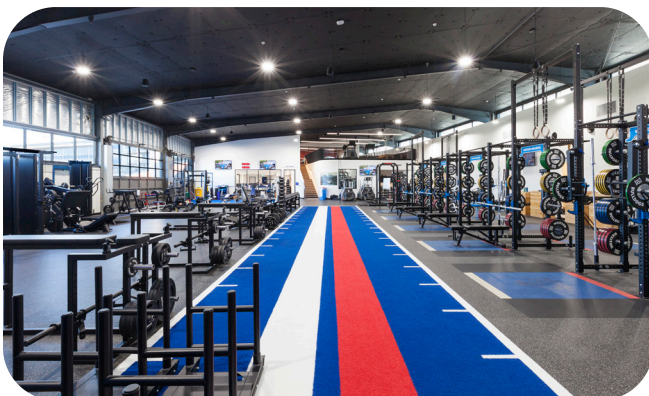
This remarkable project has transformed the Whitten Oval into an elite sports facility, now featuring:

- Comprehensive change room and recovery facilities
- Cutting edge broadcasting lighting and new community spaces
- Upgraded entryways, a refreshed club shop, and an interactive museum; and
- Top tier combined AFLW and AFL training facilities, including an indoor training field.

Working collaboratively with the client, consultants and our trade partners early on, ADCO assisted the Club in finalising the design development, developing staging, buildability and delivery strategies.

The early works involved the demolition of the existing E.J. Whitten Stand and upgrades to site services relocations.

## The Pavilion Performing Arts Centre, NSW

### SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

The Pavilion is the new home of performing arts in Sutherland Shire, rebuilt on the site of the Sutherland Entertainment Centre, located in Sydney's south.

The building's key architectural feature is a striking Glulam timber atrium, locally sourced from Victoria which provides a stunning and grand entrance to the new development.

The new 683-seat auditorium, orchestra pit, stage, flytower, dressing rooms, meeting rooms and rehearsal space, ensures the community is now capable of hosting larger and more varied performances within the Shire area. New vertical transportation has been installed to provide enhanced access and mobility.

External landscaping to the surrounding Peace Park area provides a more integrated relationship with the building and connects the promenade with the new development.

This exciting project has been a true collaboration between our client Sutherland Shire Council, superintendent Root Partnership and architects NBRS/CHROFI.

## Bay Pavilions, NSW

### EUROBODALLA SHIRE COUNCIL

ADCO proudly completed the new leisure, aquatic and arts precinct in Batemans Bay for Eurobodalla Shire Council, now open for use on the South Coast of NSW.

The new Bay Pavilions has now replaced Batemans Bay's existing pool at Mackay Park, providing a 25-metre, eight-lane pool with ramp access, a warm-water therapy pool, an indoor leisure pool with learn-to-swim and toddler areas, water-play areas and waterslides, a gym, group fitness rooms, and amenities.

The Bay Pavilions offer arts and cultural facilities including the 350-seat Yuin theatre, dressing and green rooms, rehearsal space, art exhibition and storage space, meeting and multi-purpose rooms and amenities.

ADCO was pleased to work with Eurobodalla Shire Council and architects NBRS to bring this long-awaited project to life.

## Gippsland Regional Aquatic Centre, Vic

### LATROBE CITY COUNCIL

The \$57 million Gippsland Regional Aquatic Centre (GRAC) in Traralgon offers multiple new sports and leisure facilities for Latrobe City Council, Victoria.

ADCO's work on this community project included the demolition of the existing outdoor pool complex, contaminated ground remediation, and Design and Construction of the new aquatic centre.

The aquatic centre features an indoor, FINA compliant, 50-metre competition pool including 500 spectator seats, indoor learn to swim and warm water pools, aquaplay equipment and slides, and an outdoor 25-metre pool. Also included are a gym, and various multi-purpose rooms and wellness spaces.

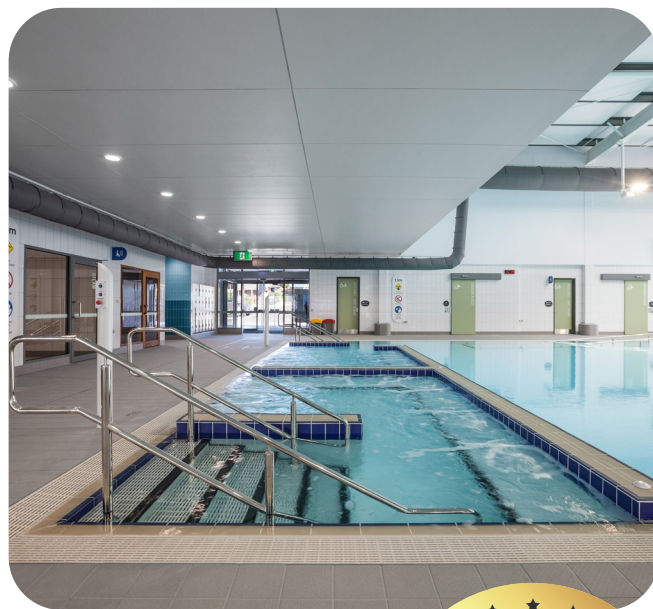

## Narangba Works Depot, Qld

### MORETON BAY REGIONAL COUNCIL

The project scope for the new Moreton Bay Regional Council (MBRC) Works Depot which is situated along Boundary Road in Narangba has enabled the amalgamation of three existing MBRC depots into the one facility.

The project included a new 3-level office building, warehouse, stores building, wash bay, refuelling station, car and vehicle parking and all associated infrastructure. External works included a signalised intersection and road widening and upgrade works to Boundary Road.

The site covers an area of 60,828m<sup>2</sup> and GFA of 6,456m<sup>2</sup> and is listed on the Environmental Management Register (EMR) due to its history of landfill use including sewage sludge, tannery and metal coating wastes. The extensive earthworks associated with this project included dynamic compaction of the existing fill and the import of circa 135,000m<sup>3</sup> of imported material to level the site and allow the construction of the depot in clean fill areas.

## Shepparton Law Courts, Vic

### COURT SERVICES VICTORIA

ADCO secured the \$70 million Shepparton Law Courts Main Works redevelopment through an Early Contractor Involvement (ECI) method of procurement.

Stage 1 involved the construction of a new multi-jurisdictional courts facility capable of meeting current and future community demand. The new centre is comprised of a multi-level facility housing six court rooms, basement, custodial zone, security facilities, judicial chambers, and administrative areas, offices, meeting rooms, lobby and associated amenities.

The facilities reflect the most contemporary applications of courthouse design, information technology, environmental sustainability and changing justice delivery models. The design also ensures capability to accommodate future service demands in the region.

The entry lobby is inspired by the image of the ancient River Red Gum and the base of the new building founded on brick – a throwback of older country court houses. The new five-story building engages with the older adjacent 1930s Court House by way of a generous landscaped public plaza that serves the courts' staff and visitors.

Stage Two works involved the demolition of the existing 1980's court house and the completion of the forecourt.

The multi-level facility includes six courtrooms, a custodial zone, security facilities, judicial chambers, administrative areas and associated amenities.

The strategy to construct the new court building, before demolishing the existing 1980s court, was designed so that legal proceedings could continue unhindered.

## Gold Coast Cultural Precinct, Qld

### CITY OF GOLD COAST

This striking, world-class community facility includes a Versatile Outdoor Space (VOS) – a stage and event platform in a garden-style amphitheatre, catering for audiences of 5,000, and able to host a wide range of civic events and performances.

Within the VOS, the performance stage has full lighting and sound installations behind the retractable amphitheatre wall, allowing the multi-functional space to be used as a conference/event room. Included within the amphitheatre structure is a catering kitchen and dressing rooms.

Additional works included extensive landscaping, seating, toilet amenities, and pedestrian and cycle bridges.

Design defines ADCO as much as construction quality. This \$85 million project involved the redevelopment of Lane Cove's village parking into a dynamic, multi-purpose public space.

Construction saw Rosenthal Avenue car park become a new, centralised green space, supported by 500 improved underground car parking spaces and an additional retail precinct.

The meticulously landscaped green space offers the community a new amphitheatre, play equipment, space for seven restaurants with indoor and outdoor seating, BBQ facilities, amenities, extensive landscaping and a 'green wall' vertical garden and a footbridge providing pedestrian connectivity across Rosenthal Avenue. The space is complemented by eye-catching feature art, notably the large curved and raking canopy roof with mirror reflective shingles and skylight.

ADCO was awarded the \$85 million project based on our ability to solve the logistical issues of working within an existing building and adjacent to an operational club. The first stage of the stunning extension is now complete and open to patrons, after just over a year of careful planning. This important milestone has delivered a unique and premium casual dining and entertainment precinct which includes a variety of food offerings, main bar, expansive kids' play area, ample indoor seating and outdoor alfresco dining area – all supported by one of the largest kitchen fit-outs in Sydney.

A new 248-space basement and suspended car park, grand entry, and the highly anticipated Char Steakhouse were also handed over during a busy 2019 with subsequent staged works completed in 2020, including a new cocktail bar, pre-function bar space and function and meeting rooms.

Entertainment areas include a spacious grand foyer, an expansive marketplace, courtyard pavilion and alfresco dining area. The updated facility also boasts impressive lower ground and multi-deck parking.

## Art Gallery of Western Australia Refurbishment, WA

### BMW

ADCO proudly undertook a major transformation of the Art Gallery of Western Australia (AGWA)'s rooftop, in addition to basement-level restoration lab improvements.

AGWA's existing rooftop was redeveloped to offer 'Elevate' – an open-air sculpture walk featuring pieces from the State Collection, a multi-purpose venue with capacity of 500 people, a new internal gallery, sky bridge, external lift and a 34-metre artwork.

Construction utilised 75 tonnes of steel, 180,000 screws to fix down 13,500 linear metres of decking boards, 27 tonnes worth of glass installed and procured from overseas, with the largest auto door installed weighing in at 700kg. Additionally, the largest artwork in the WA state-owned collection which is 34 metres long was also installed, created by Noongar artist Christopher Pease.

Existing conservation labs occupying the rooftop were relocated to the basement level and improvements to better preserve WA art were undertaken.

ADCO was pleased to work with Perth-based TAG Architects and Sydney firm fjmt as project architects.
